Islander Nadin Morales said: "We're a little sad...but the sea is sinking the island." She added: "Climate change has had a major impact....The tide comes to a level it didn't before." Ms Morales hopes her community will prosper in its new location. This is two kilometres from the port from which boats go to Gardi Sugdub.
